
Mojave Trails National Monument SERVICE PROJECT

This service project will be at the southeastern corner of Sheephole Valley Wilderness. The event will improve naturalness within and adjacent to the Sheephole Valley Wilderness. We will be cleaning debris, improving camping areas, installing fences and assisting with restoration. There are multiple sites with projects available for Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, Venturing Crews, and Sea Scouts.

A primitive camp site will be available for Scouts adjacent to Highway 62. This site will be marked for incoming groups.

The campsite and project gathering location is at: Lat. 34° 5'44.56"N, Long. 115°39'14.40"W

This site is 130 miles from Riverside, 89 miles from Palm Springs, 24 miles from Twentynine Palms, CA and 130 miles from Bullhead City, AZ.

MORE INFORMATION ON THE BACK.

Transportation- Anyone helping transport Scouts to any of the service project sites will need to use a high clearance vehicle. The dirt road leading to one of our project sites has some loose pack dirt that will be tricky to drive through.

The nearest gas station to the service project sites is 24 miles away in Twentynine Palms and the service project sites are 15 minutes away from our meeting area. Please top off your gas in your vehicle in Twentynine Palms before heading out to our meeting area shown on the map on the front of this flyer.

Camping, Food, And Facilities- Due to the distance from populated areas, it is recommended that Scouts camp out on Friday night and (if needed) Saturday night. There will be primitive camping available at the service project gathering location shown on the front page of this flyer.

Everyone will need to provide their own dinner on Friday evening. Cahuilla Lodge will provide Saturday breakfast, lunch, dinner. Sunday morning breakfast will be on your own.

There will be outhouses available at each service project site and camping area.

What To Bring- Scouts will need to bring face covering or mask due to Covid-19, work clothes, work gloves, rakes, shovels, water, snacks, sun screen, sun hat, 10 essentials, tent and sleeping bag if you are camping, a copy of the Scouts BSA medical form with parts A and B completed, CIEC Covid-19 waiver, and a completed BLM Volunteer Service Agreement form.

Registration And Cost- There is no cost to participate in this service project. Everyone can register to attend by visiting the Cahuilla Lodge website at www.snakepower.org. When you register please indicate if you will be camping on Saturday night or staying for Saturday night dinner.

Everyone participating in the service project is required to provide a copy of their Scouts BSA medical form with parts A and B completed, CIEC Covid-19 waiver, and the BLM Volunteer Services Agreement completed. A copy of the BLM Volunteer Services Agreement can be downloaded from the Cahuilla Lodge website at www.snakepower.org. Without these two forms you may not participate in the service project.
