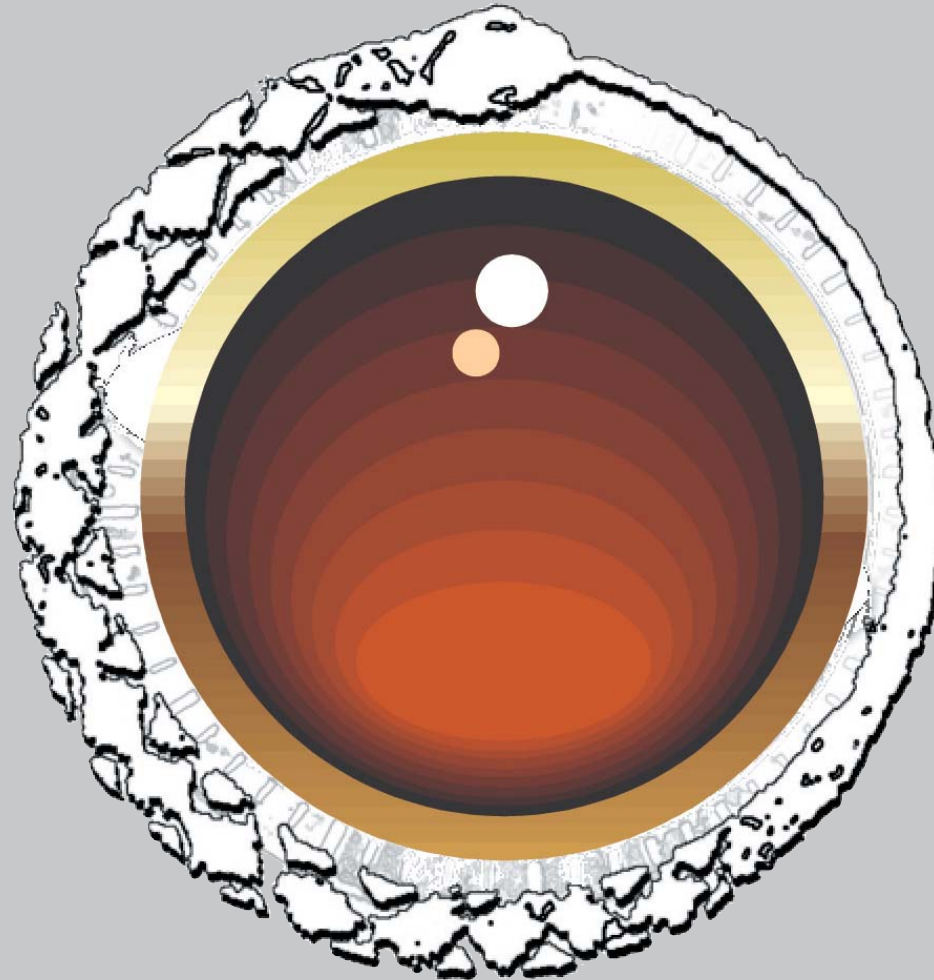

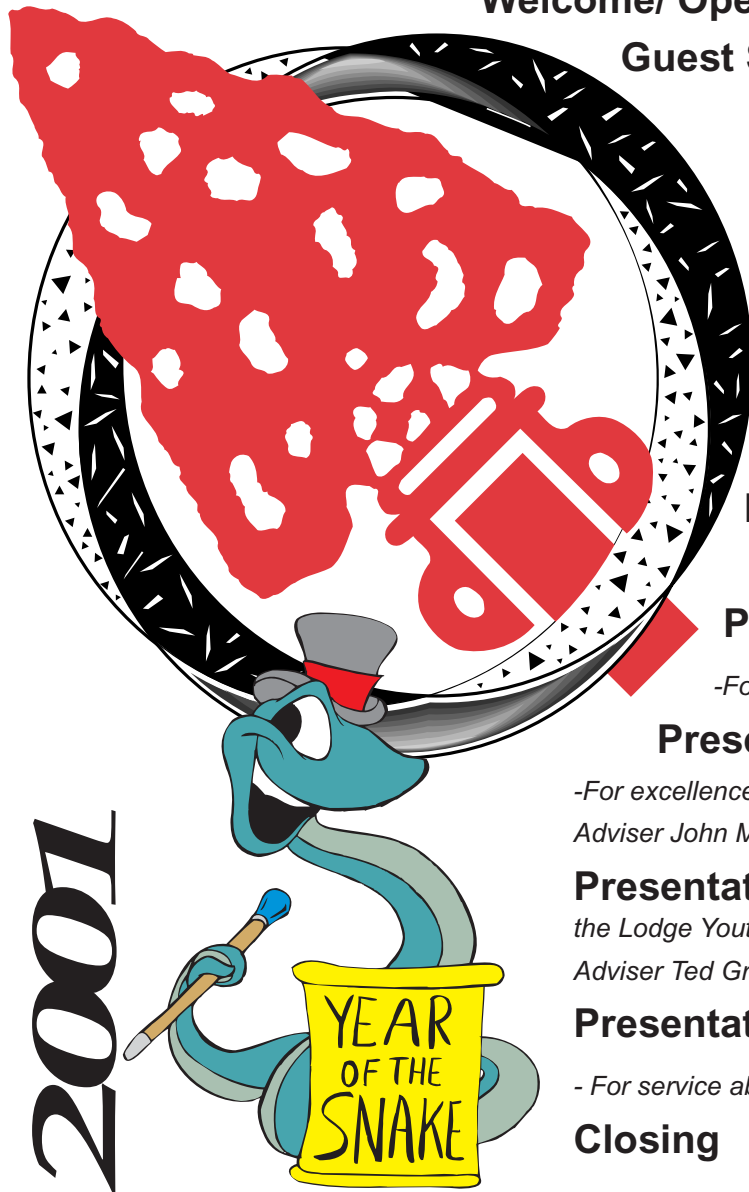

*Cahuilla Lodge formed from the merger of Tahquitz Lodge #127 and Wisumahi Lodge #478 and was first chartered on January 1, 1973. A-tsa Lodge #380 was absorbed in 1974 (some have put the year at 1976 but A-tsa was not chartered after 1974).

Although Cahuilla Lodge was chartered on January 1, 1973, both Tahquitz and Wisumahi were not ready for the merger. In fact, the two lodges continued to meet separately for the first half of the year. So who was actually the first lodge chief? Actually, there was an Office of the Lodge chief, occupied by the two outgoing chiefs from the merging lodges: Ken Dewitt from Wisumahi and Jon Nelson from Tahquitz. This continued all the way until October, when Cahuilla hosted a Fall Ordeal and the first lodge officers were elected.

In late 1973, Karl Hartmetz from Troop 62 in Barstow became Cahuilla Lodge's first elected lodge chief. Cahuilla has installed their officers in the Fall every year since, making it one of the lodge's greatest traditions.

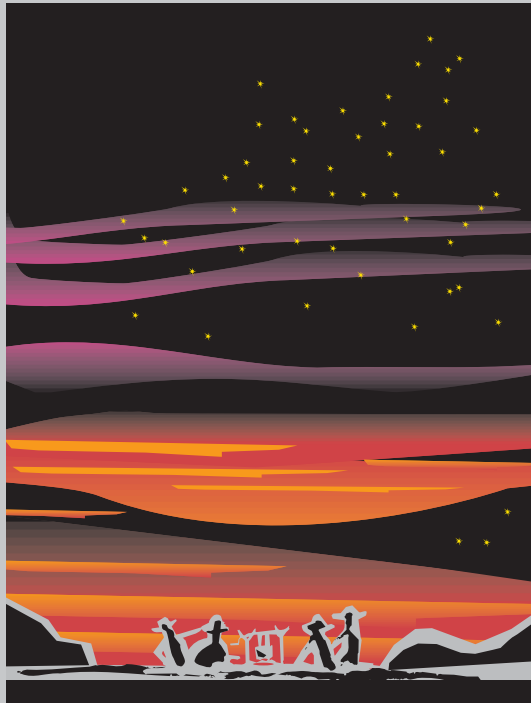

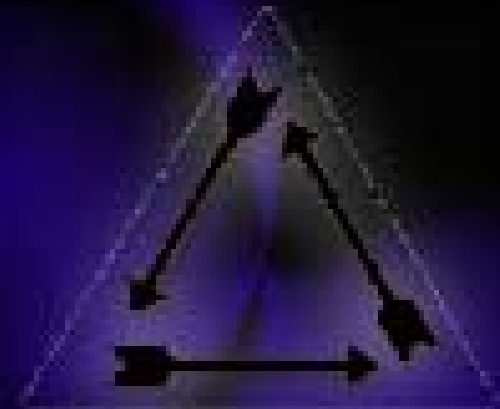

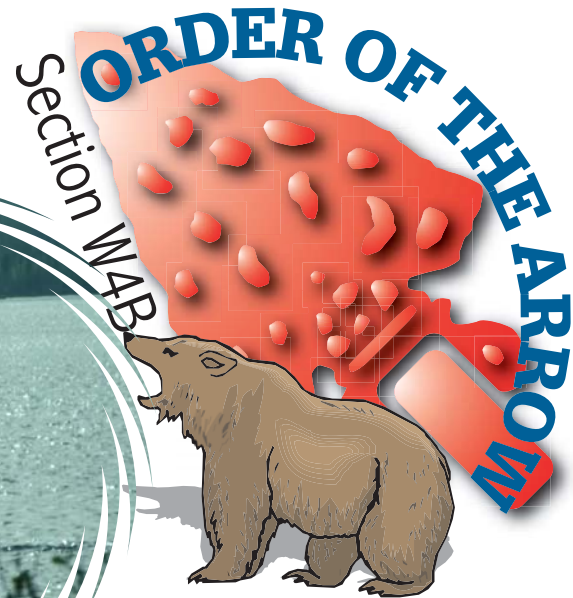
