






Chapter Highlights

August Ordeal

Registration for the Ordeal Induction Weekend can be completed online through the council website(available on Snakepower.org). All participants must pre-register by August 4th; no walk-ins will be accepted. The ordeal will take place at Camp Emerson from August 8 to 10. Meals are provided throughout the weekend, except on Friday evening. If you need special accommodations or have dietary restrictions, contact Lodge Adviser Cynthia Blessum at adviser@snakepower.org. Current members who have paid their dues can register as General Members or serve as Elangomats—Arrowmen who guide Ordeal Candidates through the induction process. If you've been an Ordeal member for at least six months and have paid your 2025 dues, you're eligible to seal your membership by registering as a Brotherhood Candidate. All attendees must bring a complete BSA uniform, OA sash, BSA Health Form parts A & B, and camping essentials including a tent, sleeping bag, warm clothing, and work gloves. Brotherhood requirements and a full packing list are available via Snakepower.org.

Conclave

Conclave is a section-wide event where the Cahuilla Lodge participates in training, activities, and competitions alongside the Puvunga and Wiatava Lodges, all of which comprise Section G18s. There will be enjoyable activities for Arrowmen of all ages and abilities to ensure that no one is left out of the fun.

This year, Conclave will take place at the Irvine Ranch Outdoor Education Center from August 22 to 24. The registration cost is \$65 per person (both youth and adults), but there is a discounted rate of \$55 for first-year Arrowmen (those who were inducted in 2025). Please ensure you register before August 11th, as prices will increase to \$85 per person after that date.

Fall Fellowship






